Estimated Cost of Renting in Victoria	Depending on whether students rent a room or an entire apartment, rent prices in Victoria can range from \$500/month to \$1,500/month. A safe estimate for monthly rental of shared accommodation (including utilities) is CAD \$800.
Where to Live?	Victoria is a smaller city and nothing is ever very far. Royal Roads University is located in Colwood, which is about a 20-30 minute drive from downtown Victoria, depending on traffic. Some neighbourhoods that provide easy access to the RRU campus: Colwood Langford View Royal If students prefer to live downtown Victoria or in a neighbourhood closer to downtown Victoria, please note that commuting times can run as long as one hour in each direction depending on traffic and number of bus transfers required.
