

Canada's 2nd official language could be the key to PR

Express Entry requires NCLC 7 in each ability to be included in the French category draws.

Achieving level 7 in each ability adds 50 points to your EE score.

BC PNP - achieving NCLC 4 in each ability adds 10 pts to your BC PNP score.

TCF and TEF are the IRCC approved French tests.

<u>Francophone Mobility Program - Work Permit Extensions</u>

Requires French test showing at least NCLC 5 in Listening and Speaking only.

Requires job offer outside of Quebec and employer must register offer in IRCC employer portal.

Employer-specific work permit - up to 3 - 5 years and is extendable

If job offer is skilled (TEER 0, 1, 2 or 3), adds 50 CRS pts to EE score for those who have worked for the employer in Canada for one continuous year.

Canadian Experience Class - Eligibility

(Express Entry application)

- 1 year of full-time/part-time work experience inside Canada within 3 years
 - Only TEER 0, 1, 2 or 3 jobs
 - Full-time at one or more jobs
 - Equal amount in part-time work
- NO education requirements
- Minimum language requirements
 - CLB 7 for TEER 0 or 1 jobs
 - CLB 5 for TEER 2 or 3 jobs
- Work experience while studying is not eligible
- Self-employment is not eligible
- NO settlement funds required



Federal Skilled Worker - Eligibility

(Express Entry application)

1 year skilled work experience

• At least 1 year of continuous, full-time (or equivalent), paid, TEER 0, 1, 2 or 3 work in ONE occupation in the last 10 years. SELF EMPLOYMENT IS OK!

Language at CLB 7

At least CLB 7 on ALL language abilities

Education

 Completion of secondary or post-secondary credential in Canada; OR foreign credential with ECA report showing equivalency to Canadian credential

Selection factor score

• Minimum score of 67/100 required in the 6 selection factors: language, education, work experience, age, arranged employment, adaptability

Settlement funds <u>OR</u> arranged employment

Minimum settlement funds for family size OR arranged employment described in R82(2)(a), (b) or
 (d) - If you have an open work permit, you do not meet the definition of arranged employment



Category specific rounds of ITAs (Express Entry application)

- 6 Categories
 - Healthcare 34 occupations
 - STEM 24 occupations
 - Trades 10 occupations
 - Agriculture 3 occupations
 - Transportation 10 occupations
 - French NCLC 7 or higher in all abilities
- To be eligible to receive ITA in category specific round, in addition to being eligible in FSW, FST or CEC, must also have at least 6 continuous months of full-time work experience in <u>one</u> of the occupations listed in the above categories within the last 3 years. Experience can be in Canada or abroad.

BC PNP

BC Provincial Nominee Program

International Graduate and International Post-Graduate streams will be replaced with three new streams:

- Bachelor's stream will be for recent graduates with bachelor's degrees from eligible post-secondary institutions. Graduates with an indeterminate full-time job offer can register for this stream
- Master's stream will be for recent graduates with master's degrees from eligible post-secondary institutions, in any field of study. Graduates with a minimum one-year full-time job offer in a skilled occupation can register for this stream
- Doctorate stream will be for graduates and candidates of doctoral level programs from eligible post-secondary institutions. Graduates and PhD candidates can apply directly to this stream

BC Provincial Nominee Program

Skilled Worker

- Have a job offer from an eligible BC employer in TEER 0, 1, 2, 3
- Have two years of full-time work experience in TEER 0, 1, 2, 3 job
- Minimum language levels may be increased in Jan 2025
- Meet minimum income requirements for family size

BC Provincial Nominee Program

ELSS (Entry Level and Semi-Skilled)

- Have a job offer from a BC employer in the tourism/hospitality or food processing sector
 - Only eligible jobs (list)
 - Northeast Development Region of BC, any TEER 4 or 5 job is eligible, except caregivers
- Have been working full-time for nine consecutive months
- Meet language and education requirements language minimums may be increased in January 2025
- Meet minimum income requirements for family size





NOC/TEER System Employers Express Entry profile & BC PNP registration





NOC/TEER System

TEER	Occupation types	Examples
TEER 0	Management occupations	Advertising, marketing and public relations managers Financial managers
TEER 1	Occupations that usually require a university degree	Financial advisors Software engineers
TEER 2	 Occupations that usually require a college diploma apprenticeship training of 2 or more years, or supervisory occupations 	Computer network and web technicians Medical laboratory technologists
TEER 3	 Occupations that usually require a college diploma apprenticeship training of less than 2 years, or more than 6 months of on-the-job training 	Bakers Dental assistants and dental laboratory assistants
TEER 4	 Occupations that usually require a high school diploma, or several weeks of on-the-job training 	Home child care providers Retail salespersons and visual merchandisers
TEER 5	Occupations that usually need short-term work demonstration and no formal education	Landscaping and grounds maintenance labourers Delivery service drivers and door-to-door distributors

NOC / TEER Website

- To determine skill level of work
- Focus on the lead statement and main duties (<u>NOT</u> Job title or Employment Requirements)
- Don't waste time in a non-eligible job



NOC/TEER System

- Use the 2nd number of the 5-digit NOC code to determine your TEER category
- The 2nd number corresponds directly with the TEER category of the occupation
 - NOC 6<u>0</u>020 Retail Manager TEER 0 occupation
 - NOC 1<u>1</u>100 Accountant TEER 1 occupation
 - NOC 52120 Graphic Designer TEER 2 occupation
 - NOC 73400 Heavy Equipment Operator TEER 3 occupation
 - NOC 94100 Machine Operator TEER 4 occupation
 - NOC 65200 Food and Beverage Server TEER 5 occupation
- TEERs 0, 1, 2 and 3 are classified as skilled work
- TEERs 4 and 5 are classified as entry level or semi-skilled




How to find your NOC

- Focus on the LEAD STATEMENT and MAIN DUTIES of any NOC description
- Your Job Title does NOT matter an employer can give you any job title they want!
- It's your DUTIES that will determine the correct/closes NOC code for you
- Sometimes it takes more than one NOC to describe your job. That's ok if both NOCs are TEER 0, 1, 2 or 3.
- Sometimes it's complicated. Get your employer involved in helping you find your NOC.
- Get legal advice if you can't figure out your NOC.

Make sure at the beginning

Big multinational corporations normally do not support employees for immigration purposes, such as:

- UBC
- Starbucks
- IKEA
- Milestones
- GAP
- Royal Bank



Express Entry

- Create a <u>profile</u> in Express Entry if you're <u>eligible</u> in CEC or FSW
- A profile is like a CV only your highlights, not your life story
- You will be ranked against all other eligible profiles in the pool
- Only the highest scoring profiles receive an ITA
- CRS Website

Express Entry

- Assesses: skills, education, language ability, work experience, and other factors
- NEVER underestimate strong language scores! Aim for CLB 9 or higher
- Where to get extra point?
 - Provincial nomination (600 points)
 - Valid job offer based on LMIA or Trade Agreement (50 or 200 points depending on NOC)
 - Canadian education at a publicly funded or degree granting institution (15 or 30 points depending on program length or type)
 - French proficiency (25 or 50 points requires NCLC 7 or higher in all abilities)
 - PR or Canadian citizen sibling (15 points must reside in Canada)



BC PNP Registration

- Must meet eligibility criteria of your stream when you create your registration.
- Must KNOW your stream is it an EE stream or non-EE?
- Cannot amend profile after submitting if there's a change you must withdraw and create a new registration
- Similar to EE, BC PNP registration is like a CV contains highlights



BC PNP Scoring

FACTOR	MAXIMUM POINTS
Directly related work experience	40
Highest level of education	40
Language proficiency in English and/or French	40
Hourly wage of BC Job Offer	55
Area within BC	25

TOTAL MAXIMUM POINTS = 200



BC PNP - FAQ

- Will I get points for Regional Alumni by attending Royal Roads?
 - YES if you completed at least an 8 month program of study (2 semesters) and lived outside of the Metro Vancouver area during the period of study
 - Must be full-time equivalent coursework excluding co-op work terms, practicums and internships
 - ELS and distance learning portions of programs are NOT eligible
